Mr. Mike Eppolito is the acting deputy director and chief program officer for the Space Development Agency (SDA). SDA is recognized as the Department of Defense's constructive disruptor for space acquisition. SDA will quickly deliver much needed space-based capabilities to the joint warfighter to support terrestrial missions through development, fielding, and operation of the PWSA.

As chief program officer, Mr. Eppolito oversees planning, development, and fielding of all programs within the Proliferated Warfighter Space Architecture (PWSA). Before his selection as the chief program officer, Mr. Eppolito served as the Battle Management Cell chief and the Tranche O program director at SDA.

Prior to joining SDA, he managed the planning and daily execution of over 50 projects in an \$80 million research and development portfolio focused on space and intelligence systems.
